"Statues and Sculptures in Dublin City"

#### **Exploring:**

- Internet sources for the investigation: (Public Art in Dublin, Statues and Stories in Dublin- A Star Backpackers)
- Preparing for Vox Pop: Preparing a Table of Statues and Sculptures for the Survey the Irish Public about their Knowledge & Attitudes towards their Statues

### **Investigating:**

- > Finding location &taking photographic evidence of the statues
- > Interviewing local people in the street, pubs, shopping centers, bus stops etc. in groups of 3 & completing the table
- > Note-taking about the nicknames & stories they associated with the statues
- > Appreciating the friendliness and cordiality of the Irish Public

### **Processing:**

- **Data Analysis:** the most frequently mentioned statues, known nicknames, likes & dislikes about them, reasons for their popularity or disapproval, general attitude determined by age-group belongings or social status etc.
- ▶ <u>Reflection to the Survey Results:</u> percentage of expected or unexpected mentioning, conclusion & critical thinking about the importance of statues in urban human life etc.
- ► <u>Raising Critical Cultural Awareness:</u> how statues & sculptures (as pieces of Art) reflect the Irish way of thinking & attitude to life, comparisons with our cultural aspects

#### **Our Project as a Classroom Material**

#### 1. Vocabulary tasks:

- > Teaching art, history & social study vocabulary via the themes that the statues represent
- > Developing vocabulary via realising existing nicknames & devising new nicknames for the statues
- 2. Developing logical thinking by tasks:
- Predicting, matching, making comparisons, giving directions
- 3. Developing listening skills by tasks:
- Listening to talking statutes for gist & details
- > Listening to your partner's picture description & drawing

#### 4. Developing communication skills by tasks:

- > Picture descriptions
- > Task-based Field Projects in connection with the themes
- > Co-operation with the other students in teams in the Inquiry-based Learning Projects like this one: "Contexts4Content" Approach

#### 5. Developing creative writing skills:

- Creating nicknames for some statues & sculptures on display that haven't got them yet
- > Write similar stories for the statues that haven't got them yet
- > Create a top 10 list of must-see statues in Dublin City & the a city in your own area
